

Journey to Pascha Week 5 - Forgiveness Sunday



The Church now brings us to the doorway of Great Lent. Before fasting begins, before the services change, before the long journey truly starts, we are asked to do one thing first: forgive.

In today's Gospel, Christ gives us a simple but powerful command:

“If you forgive others their trespasses, your Heavenly Father will also forgive you.”

Lent is not a diet.
It is a healing of the heart.

We cannot walk toward Pascha carrying anger, resentment, or old wounds.

These burdens weigh more than any food we give up.
They keep the heart closed when God is trying to open it.

Forgiveness does not mean pretending nothing happened.
It means choosing freedom over bitterness.

It means placing judgment into God's hands and allowing grace to enter our own hearts.

This is why tonight we ask one another, “Forgive me.”
Because the journey to the Resurrection begins with reconciliation.

Let us begin Lent with light hearts, clean beginnings, and courage to love again.



Divine Liturgy Variables on Sunday, February 22, 2026 - Tone 4 / Eothinon 4
Sunday of Forgiveness (Cheese Fare) - Uncovering of the Seven Martyrs' relics at Gate of Eugenios in Constantinople; Martyr Anthusa and her twelve servants

During the Little Entrance, chant the Resurrectional Apolytikion. The Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) is "O come, let us worship... save us, O Son of God, Who art risen from the dead..." After the Little Entrance, sing these hymns in the following order:

RESURRECTIONAL APOLYTIKION IN TONE FOUR

Having learned the joyful message of the Resurrection from the angel the women disciples of the Lord cast from them their parental condemnation. And proudly broke the news to the Disciples, saying: Death hath been spoiled; Christ God is risen, granting the world Great Mercy.

POLYTIKION OF ST. GEORGE IN TONE FOUR

As deliverer of captives and defender of the poor, healer of the infirm, champion of kings, victorious Great Martyr George intercede with Christ our God to save our souls.

KONTAKION OF THE PRESENTATION OF CHRIST IN TONE SIX

O Thou Who guidest to wisdom, and givest understanding and intelligence, the Instructor of the ignorant, and Helper of the poor, strengthen my heart and grant it understanding, O Master. Give me word, O Word of the Father; for behold, I shall not refrain my lips from crying to Thee, O merciful One, have mercy upon me who am fallen.

THE EPISTLE

(For Sunday of Forgiveness)

O Lord, how magnified are Thy works. In wisdom hast Thou made them all.

Bless the Lord, O my soul.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Romans. (13:11-14:4)

Brethren, now is our salvation nearer than when we believed. The night is far spent, the day is at hand. Let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armor of light. Let us walk becomingly, as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in chambering and licentiousness, not in strife and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh to fulfill its lusts. But as for the one who is weak in faith, receive him, but not for disputes over opinions. For one believes he may eat anything; but the weak person eats herbs. Let not him who eats despise him who does not eat, and let not him who does not eat judge him who eats; for God has received him. Who are you to be the judge over the servant of a stranger? To his own master he either stands or falls; but he will be made to stand; for God is able to make him stand.

THE GOSPEL

(For Sunday of Forgiveness)

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. (6:14-21)

The Lord said to His Disciples: If you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father also will forgive you; but if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. And when you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by men but by your Father Who is in secret; and your Father Who sees in secret will reward you. Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

The First Step Into Great Lent

Beloved in Christ,

This Sunday is unlike any other Sunday of the year. Before the Church asks us to fast... before we begin the long journey toward Pascha... before the prayers of repentance fill our homes and our hearts... The Church asks us to do one thing first:

FORGIVE.

In today’s Gospel, our Lord speaks with striking simplicity:

“If you forgive others, your Heavenly Father will forgive you.”

Notice what He does not say.

- He does not say, “Fast perfectly.”
- He does not say, “Pray perfectly.”
- He does not say, “Be spiritually strong.”
- He says: **Forgive.**

Why?

Because resentment is heavier than any food we give up. Anger is harder on the soul than any fast. Pride blocks prayer more than any distraction. We cannot walk toward Pascha while carrying the weight of grudges.

Today at the end of Divine Liturgy, we will ask one another: **“Forgive me.”**

This simple act opens the gates of Lent.

Let us enter the Fast with light hearts, clean beginnings, and the courage to love again.

May God grant us a blessed and fruitful Great Lent.

**Forgiveness Sunday
The Door to Great Lent**

Today the Church places us at the gates of Paradise.

We remember Adam and Eve standing outside Eden, not because God stopped loving them, but because sin had darkened their hearts. The tragedy was not hunger. It was separation. And so;

- Before we fast from food, the Church asks us to fast from pride.
- Before we abstain from meat and dairy, we abstain from resentment.
- Before we begin Great Lent, we begin with forgiveness.

Forgiveness Sunday is not a formality. It is the key that unlocks the fast.

- Without forgiveness, fasting becomes diet.
- Without reconciliation, prayer becomes noise.
- Without humility, Lent becomes performance.

Today, when we bow before one another and say, "Forgive me," we are not performing a ritual. We are stepping back toward Paradise.

How to Ask Forgiveness? When asking forgiveness:

- Say simply: "Forgive me, a sinner."
- Do not justify yourself.
- Do not explain your actions.
- Do not expect the other person to confess in return.
- Receive forgiveness humbly.

Forgiveness is not about proving who was right. It is about healing what was broken.

You ask, How to Begin Great Lent Well?

- Attend and participate in the Forgiveness Ceremony
- Begin the Fast on Clean Monday
- Add the Prayer of St. Ephraim daily
- Increase your time in prayer
- Come to Confession early in Lent
- Choose one habit to surrender to God

Start small. Start sincerely. Start with peace.

What is The Prayer of St. Ephraim?

O Lord and Master of my life, take from me the spirit of sloth, despair, lust of power, and idle talk.

But give rather the spirit of chastity, humility, patience, and love to Thy servant.

Yea, O Lord and King, grant me to see my own sins and not to judge my brother, for Thou art blessed unto ages of ages. Amen.


